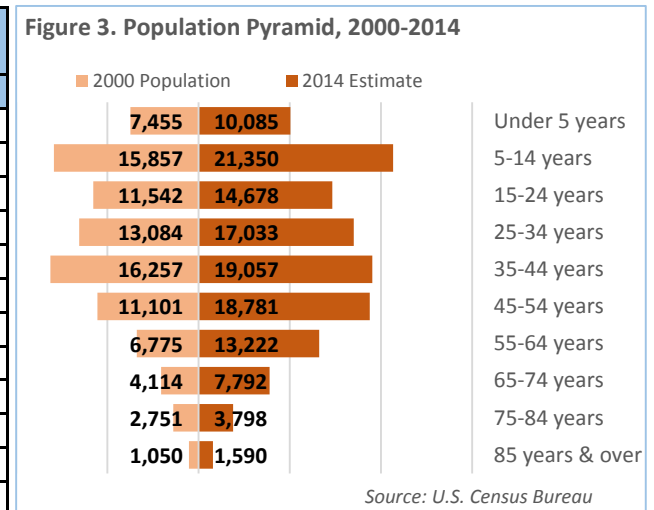


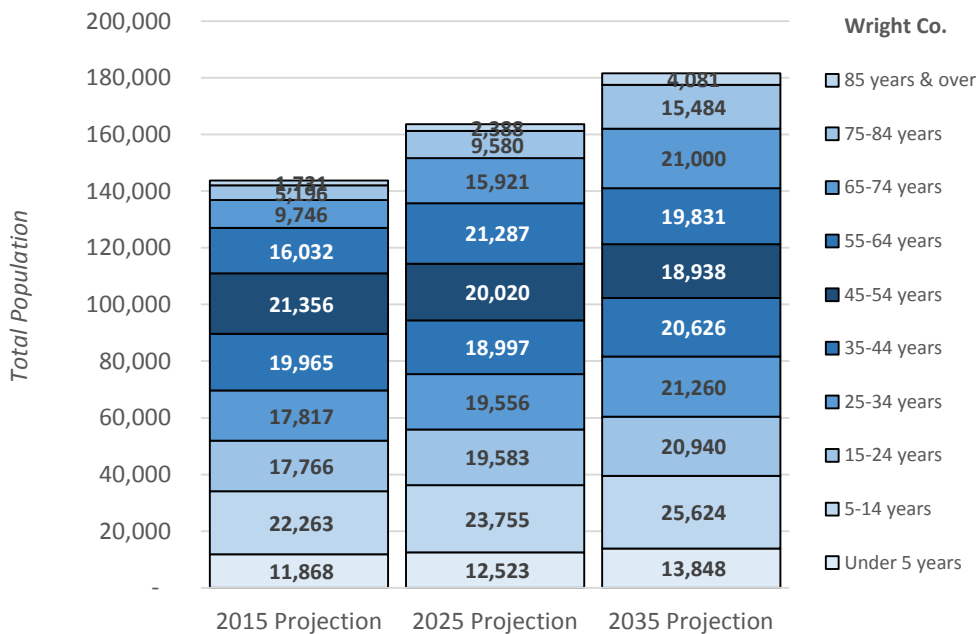

Figure 5. Annual Labor Force Estimates

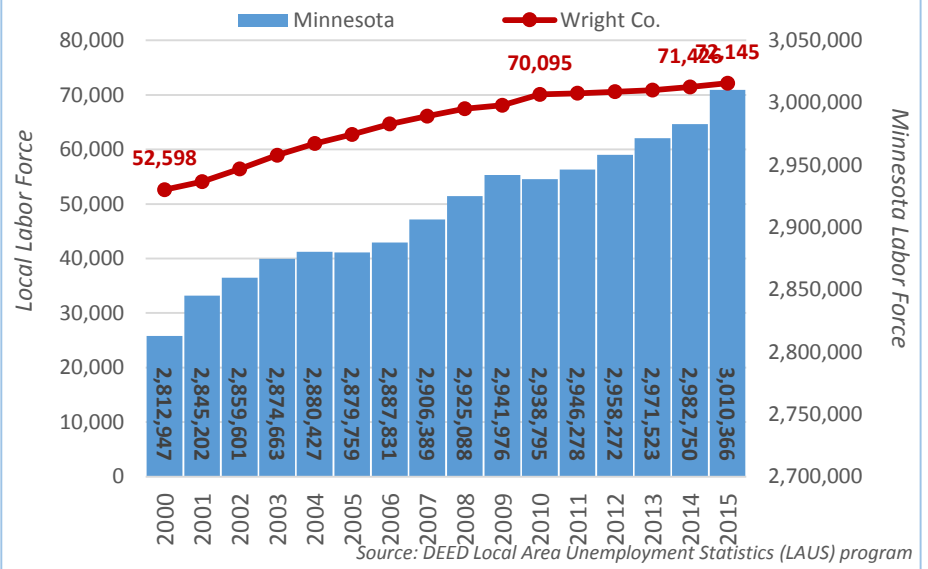


Figure 6. Unemployment Rates, 2000-2015

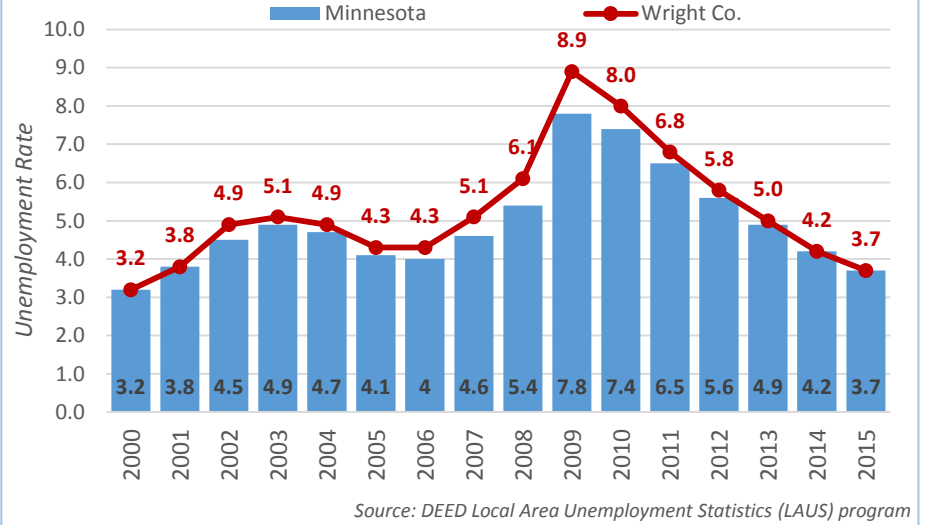


Figure 7. Jobseekers Per Vacancy, 2006-2016

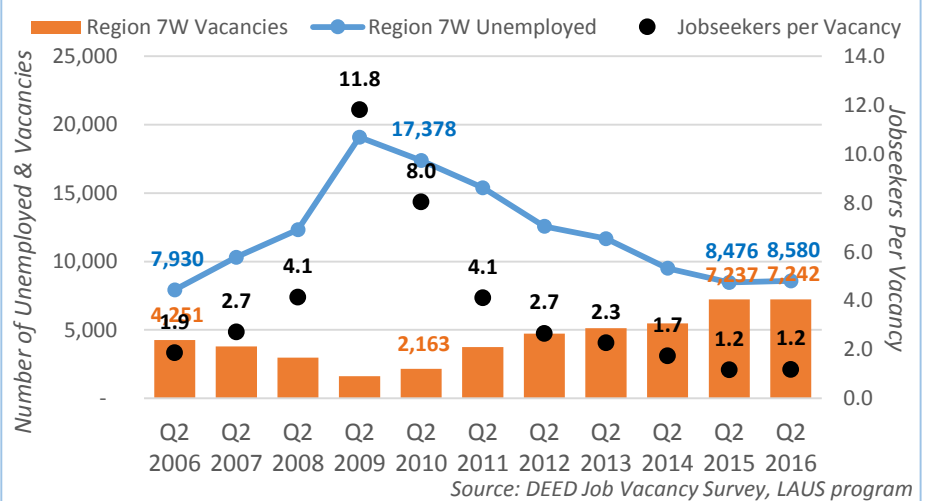

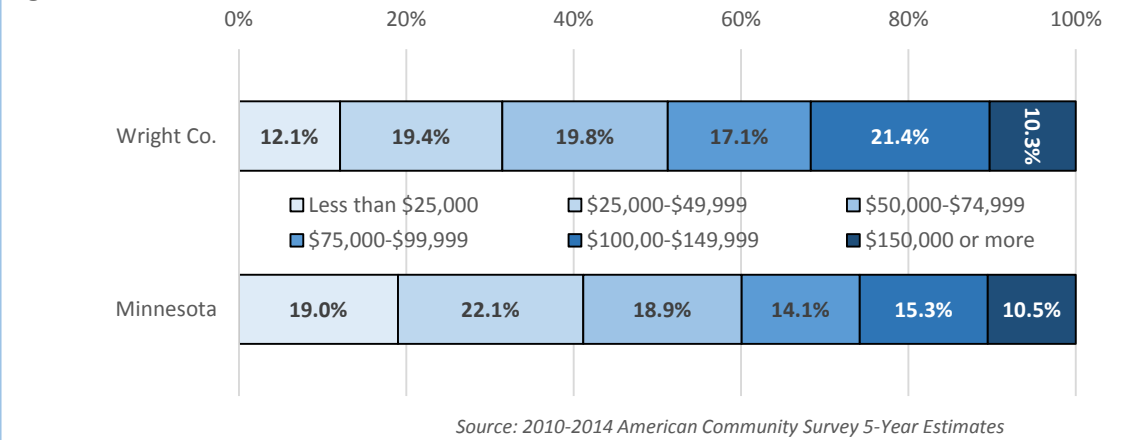

Figure 8. Household Incomes, 2014



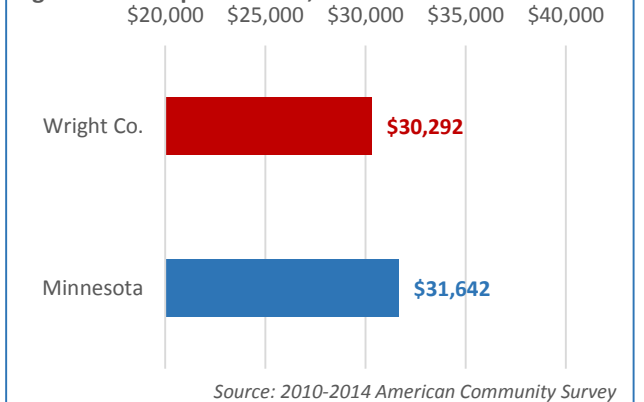

Figure 10. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 2 2016

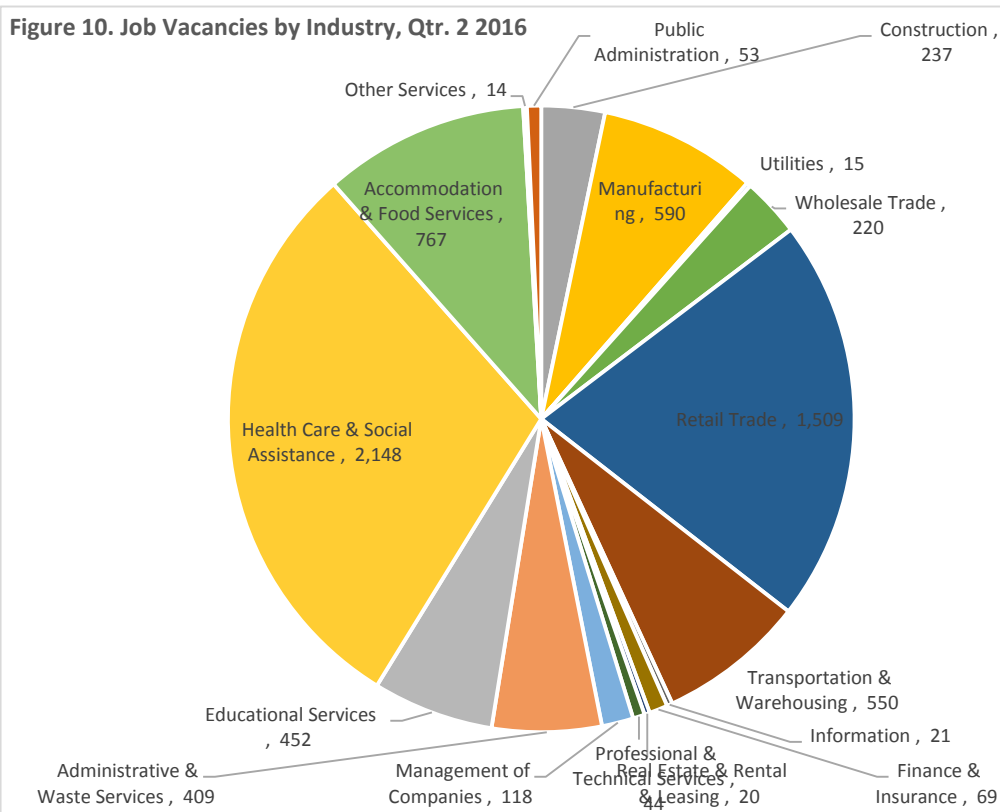
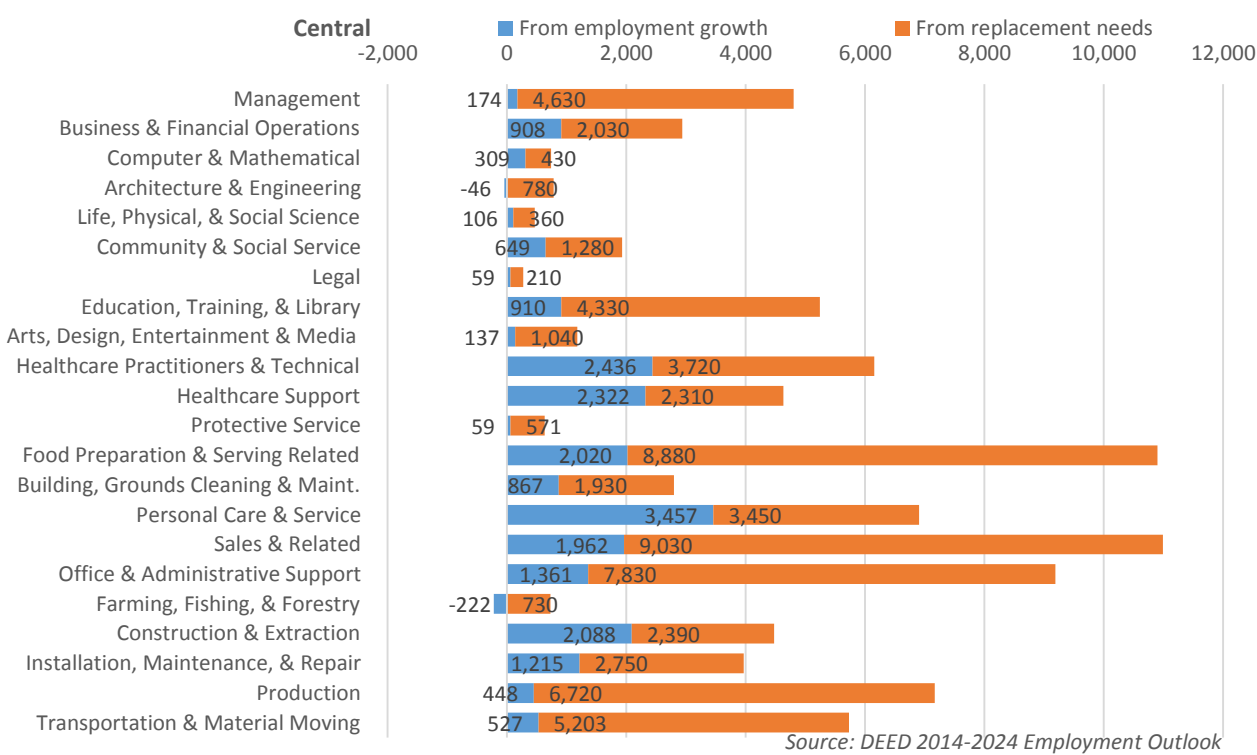

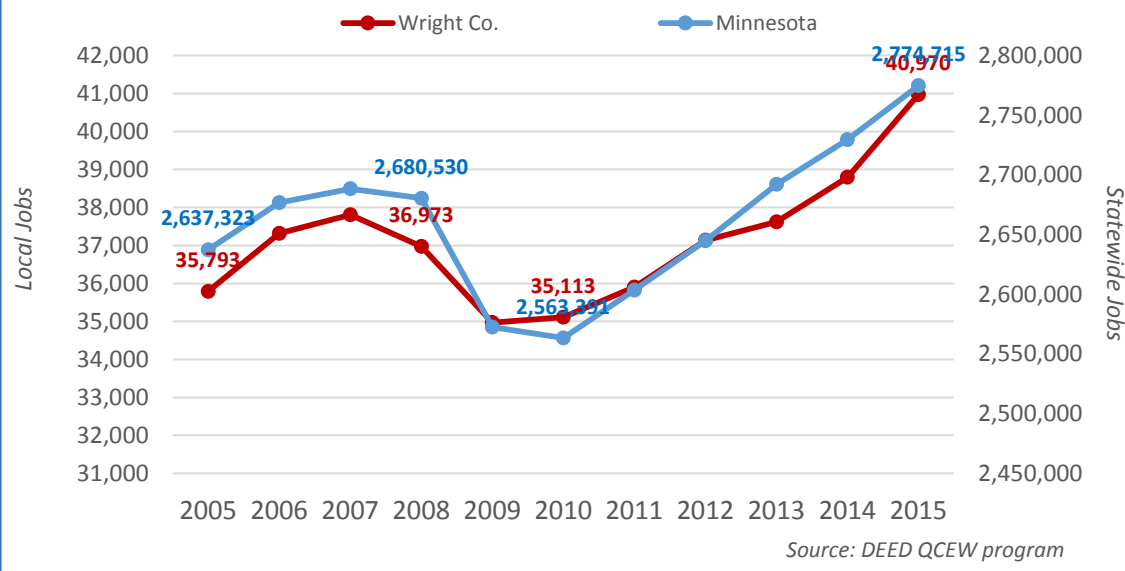
